16 Within thirty-five days from the date of start of each quarter all
17 collected building fees of each such community and technical college
18 shall be paid into the state treasury, and shall be credited as
19 follows:

20 (1) On or before June 30th of each year the college board if
21 issuing bonds payable out of building fees shall certify to the state
22 treasurer the amounts required in the ensuing twelve-month period to
23 pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on such
24 bonds. The state treasurer shall thereupon deposit the amounts so
25 certified in the community and technical college capital projects
26 account. Such amounts of the funds deposited in the community and
27 technical college capital projects account as are necessary to pay and
28 secure the payment of the principal of and interest on the building
29 bonds issued by the college board as authorized by this chapter shall
30 be exclusively devoted to that purpose. If in any twelve-month period
31 it shall appear that the amount certified by the college board is
32 insufficient to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and
33 interest on the outstanding building bonds, the state treasurer shall
34 notify the college board and such board shall adjust its certificate so
35 that all requirements of moneys to pay and secure the payment of the
36 principal and interest on all such bonds then outstanding shall be
37 fully met at all times.

1 (2) The community and technical college capital projects account is
2 hereby created in the state treasury. The sums deposited in the
3 capital projects account shall be appropriated and expended exclusively
4 to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds
5 payable out of the building fees and for the construction,
6 reconstruction, erection, equipping, maintenance, demolition and major
7 alteration of buildings and other capital assets owned by the state
8 board for community and technical colleges in the name of the state of
9 Washington, and the acquisition of sites, rights-of-way, easements,
10 improvements or appurtenances in relation thereto, and for the payment
11 of principal of and interest on any bonds issued for such purposes.
12 During the 2001-2003 fiscal biennium, the legislature may transfer from
13 the account to the state general fund such amounts as reflect the
14 excess fund balance of the account.

15 **Sec. 304.** RCW 43.30.265 and 1992 c 167 s 1 are each amended to
16 read as follows:

17 (1) The legislature finds that the department of natural resources
18 has a need to maintain the real property asset base it manages and
19 needs an accounting mechanism to complete transactions without reducing
20 the real property asset base.

21 (2) The natural resources real property replacement account is
22 created in the state treasury. This account shall consist of funds
23 transferred or paid for the disposal or transfer of real property by
24 the department of natural resources under RCW 79.01.009. The funds in
25 this account shall be used solely for the acquisition of replacement
26 real property and may be spent only when, and as, authorized by
27 legislative appropriation. For the period July 1, 2001, to June 30,
28 2003, moneys in the account may be transferred to the following
29 accounts: Permanent common school fund; scientific permanent fund;
30 charitable, educational, penal and reformatory institutions account;
31 state university permanent fund; and agricultural permanent fund.

32 **Sec. 305.** RCW 46.09.165 and 1995 c 166 s 11 are each amended to
33 read as follows:

34 The nonhighway and off-road vehicle activities program account is
35 created in the state treasury. Moneys in this account are subject to
36 legislative appropriation. The interagency committee for outdoor
37 recreation shall administer the account for purposes specified in this

1 chapter and shall hold it separate and apart from all other money,
2 funds, and accounts of the interagency committee for outdoor
3 recreation. Grants, gifts, or other financial assistance, proceeds
4 received from public bodies as administrative cost contributions, and
5 any moneys made available to the state of Washington by the federal
6 government for outdoor recreation may be deposited into the account.
7 During the 2001-2003 fiscal biennium, the legislature may transfer from
8 the account to the state general fund such amounts as reflect the
9 excess fund balance of the account.

10 **Sec. 306.** RCW 79A.25.200 and 2000 c 11 s 77 are each amended to
11 read as follows:

12 The recreation resource account is created in the state treasury.
13 Moneys in this account are subject to legislative appropriation. The
14 committee shall administer the account in accordance with this chapter
15 and chapter 79A.35 RCW and shall hold it separate and apart from all
16 other money, funds, and accounts of the committee. Moneys received
17 from the marine fuel tax refund account under RCW 79A.25.070 shall be
18 deposited into the account. Grants, gifts, or other financial
19 assistance, proceeds received from public bodies as administrative cost
20 contributions, and moneys made available to the state of Washington by
21 the federal government for outdoor recreation may be deposited into the
22 account. During the 2001-2003 fiscal biennium, the legislature may
23 transfer from the account to the state general fund such amounts as
24 reflect the excess fund balance of the account.

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 307.** If any provision of this act or its
26 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
27 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
28 persons or circumstances is not affected.

29 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 308.** This act is necessary for the immediate
30 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
31 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
32 immediately.
