BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Making supplemental transportation appropriations.

1 (a) Traffic safety cameras may take pictures of the vehicle and

5 enforcement system is used by placing signs on street locations that  
6 clearly indicate to a driver that he or she is entering a zone where  
7 traffic laws are enforced by an automated traffic enforcement system;

8 (c) Cities and counties using traffic safety cameras must provide  
9 periodic notice by mail to its citizens indicating the zones in which  
10 the traffic safety cameras will be used;

11 (d) Notices of infractions must be mailed to the registered owner  
12 of a vehicle within fourteen days of the infraction occurring;

13 (e) The owner of the vehicle is not responsible for the violation  
14 if the owner of the vehicle, within fifteen days after notification of  
15 the violation, furnishes the officials or agents of the municipality  
16 that issued the citation with:

17 (i) An affidavit made under oath, stating that the vehicle involved  
18 was, at the time, stolen or in the care, custody, or control of some  
19 person other than the registered owner; or

20 (ii) Testimony in open court under oath that the person was not the  
21 operator of the vehicle at the time of the alleged violation;

22 (f) Infractions detected through the use of traffic safety cameras  
23 are not part of the registered owner's driving record under RCW  
24 46.52.101 and 46.52.120; and

25 (g) By January 1, 2003, the traffic safety commission shall provide  
26 a report to the legislature regarding the use, public acceptance,  
27 outcomes, and other relevant issues regarding traffic safety cameras  
28 demonstrated by the pilot projects.

34 that are currently in use or that potentially could be in use on the  
35 state roadways, as well as on state bridges; and the effect on public

1 safety. The study may examine state and federal laws that affect fire-  
2 fighting apparatuses. House of representatives transportation  
3 committee cochairs shall each appoint one member from their respective  
4 caucus to serve as cochair of the study group. The study shall be  
5 staffed by house of representatives transportation committee staff.  
6 The study group will report back to the house of representatives  
7 transportation committee by January 1, 2002.

8 (5) The legislative transportation committee shall conduct a  
9 feasibility study of potential for economic partnerships between the  
10 Washington state ferries and local government entities, including but  
11 not limited to port districts. The study is intended to improve ferry  
12 terminals. The study shall, at a minimum, identify the market,  
13 physical, and economic factors that should be examined in determining  
14 whether an economic or commercial development partnership project on or  
15 around Washington state ferry terminals is likely to produce revenue  
16 for the partners. The study shall apply those factors to an analysis  
17 of each terminal used by Washington state ferries and recommend whether  
18 further exploration of state and local partnerships would be of  
19 potential economic benefit to the partners. The entity selected to  
20 perform the study through the request for proposals process will report  
21 back to the transportation committees of the legislature by December 1,  
22 2001.

23 (6) The legislative transportation committee, in cooperation with  
24 an areawide transportation system or systems, shall undertake an  
25 evaluation of providing locally sponsored transit services in a local  
26 community supplemental to those services provided by an areawide  
27 system. The evaluation shall address:

- 28 (a) The costs and benefits of providing such services;  
29 (b) The impact of such service on ridership on the areawide system  
30 and on any regional systems;  
31 (c) Funding options for supplemental services; and  
32 (d) Institutional arrangements affecting the institution of  
33 supplemental services.

34 The committee shall work with the department of transportation,  
35 areawide transit providers, community officials, private businesses,  
36 labor organizations, and others as appropriate in conducting the  
37 evaluation, and in developing a pilot project if feasible. The

1 committee shall provide an interim progress report to the legislature  
2 by January 2002. The committee shall report its findings to the  
3 legislature not later than December 1, 2002.
