3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
4 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
5 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
6 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
7 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
8 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
9 ending June 30, 2017, out of the several funds specified in this act.

10 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
11 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

12 (a) "Fiscal year 2016" or "FY 2016" means the period beginning
13 July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016.

14 (b) "Fiscal year 2017" or "FY 2017" means the period beginning
15 July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017.

16 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
17 unappropriated status.

18 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
19 only for the specified purpose.

20 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
21 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
22 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
23 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

24 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
25 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
26 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
27 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
28 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
29 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
30 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2017-2019
31 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
32 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
33 the project or program in the future.

1 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
2 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
3 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
4 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
5 remaining on June 30, 2015, from the 2013-2015 biennial
6 appropriations for each project.

 16 proposed.

17 (3) Grants for homes for families with children specified in
 18 subsection (1)(b) of this section must be for projects for which the
 19 affordable housing organization has developed agreements with the
 20 local school district to support school district recommended
 21 activities to improve educational outcomes for students living in the
 22 affordable housing facility. The agreements must include specific
 23 expectations of the parent or guardian to support the child's
 24 education.

4 of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond
5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the
6 appropriations contained in this act are thirty-eight million dollars
7 for the 2015-2017 biennium, two hundred thirty million dollars for
8 the 2017-2019 biennium, and three hundred twenty-eight million
9 dollars for the 2019-2021 biennium.

10 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7002.** ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND
11 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies
12 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency,
13 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in
14 not more than the principal amounts indicated, plus financing
15 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When
16 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most
17 economical financial contract option available, including long-term
18 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to
19 purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of
20 participation. Expenditures made by an agency for one of the

6 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase a permanent location for

8 (5) Western Washington University: Enter into a financing
9 contract for up to \$6,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
10 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the carver building
11 renovation.

12 (6) Department of corrections: Enter into a financing contract
13 for up to \$2,163,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
14 for the remodel of the correctional industry's food factory.

15 (7) Washington State Patrol: Enter into a financing contract for
16 up to \$13,700,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
17 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to replace the fire training academy
18 burn building, however, local agencies that use the burn building
19 must have indicated support for required fee increases to pay for the
20 debt service for the financing contract. Indication of support means
21 at least sixty percent of local agencies which have used the facility
22 within the prior ten years support the fee increase.

23 (8) Community and technical colleges:

24 (a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Centralia
25 Community College for up to \$5,000,000 plus financing expenses and
26 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate the
27 student services building.

28 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Centralia
29 Community College for up to \$3,000,000 plus financing expenses and
30 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase or
31 construct student housing.

32 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Clark College
33 for up to \$8,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
34 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate the culinary arts facility.

35 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Clark College
36 for up to \$35,000,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
37 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to design and construct a student
38 recreation center.

39 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia Basin
40 College for up to \$7,000,000 plus financing expenses and required

1 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to design and construct a
2 health science center.

3 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Green River
4 College for up to \$15,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
5 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct the new Auburn
6 center.

7 (g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Highline College
8 for up to \$1,500,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
9 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate the maintenance and grounds
10 building.

11 (h) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Lower Columbia
12 College for up to \$3,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
13 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate the main building.

14 (i) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Lower Columbia
15 College for up to \$3,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
16 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate and expand the
17 Myklebust gymnasium.

18 (j) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Tacoma Community
19 College for up to \$12,000,000 plus financing expenses and required
20 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to expand a health and
21 wellness center.

22 (k) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla
23 Community College for up to \$1,500,000 plus financing expenses and
24 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a
25 workforce and business development center.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7003.** (1) Allotments for appropriations in
27 this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project
28 review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and
29 in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing
30 alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10
31 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section
32 and RCW 43.88.110.

33 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget
34 notes or in the governor's budget document.

35 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7004.** (1) The office of financial management
36 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a
37 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the
38 completion of such project to another capital project for which the

1 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand
2 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the
3 appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital
4 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or
5 institution of higher education and only between capital projects
6 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur
7 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants
8 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such
9 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes
10 that govern the grants.

11 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
12 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
13 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7006.** State agencies, including institutions
27 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
28 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
29 for operating expenditures.

30 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7007.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
31 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
32 10, 2005. Agencies and higher education institutions shall comply
33 with the requirements set forth in this executive order.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7008.** PUGET SOUND PROTECTION AND RESTORATION.
35 Consistent with RCW 90.71.340, when expending appropriations under
36 this act that contribute to Puget Sound protection and recovery,
37 agencies shall consult with the Puget Sound partnership to ensure

1 that projects and expenditures are either in, or consistent with the
2 2020 action agenda. These consultations shall include the exchange of

13 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

14 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
15 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
16 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
17 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

18 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
19 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
20 identified in RCW 43.17.020 is provided solely for the purposes of
21 RCW 43.17.200.

22 (4) At least eighty-five percent of the moneys spent by the
23 Washington state arts commission during the 2015-2017 biennium for
24 the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
25 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art. Art
26 allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will lapse.
27 The commission may use up to \$100,000 of this amount to conserve or
28 maintain existing pieces in the state art collection pursuant to RCW
29 28A.335.210.

30 (5) The executive director of the arts commission shall appoint a
31 study group to review the operations of the one-half of one percent
32 for works of art purchased or commissioned as required by RCW
33 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200. The findings of the review
34 must be reported annually to the office of financial management and
35 the fiscal committees of the legislature by August 15th. The review
36 must include, but is not limited to, the following: (a) Projects
37 purchased or commissioned per biennium; (b) partner agencies; (c)
38 funding sources by fiscal year; (d) artwork costs; (e) administrative
39 costs; (f) collection care costs; and (g) project status.

1 **Sec. 7010.** RCW 27.34.330 and 2006 c 371 s 232 are each amended
2 to read as follows:

3 The Washington state historical society shall establish a
4 competitive process to solicit proposals for and prioritize heritage
5 capital projects for potential funding in the state capital budget.
6 The society shall adopt rules governing project eligibility and
7 evaluation criteria. Application for funding of specific projects may
8 be made to the society by local governments, public development
9 authorities, nonprofit corporations, tribal governments, and other
10 entities, as determined by the society. The society, with the advice
11 of leaders in the heritage field, including but not limited to
12 representatives from the office of the secretary of state, the
13 eastern Washington state historical society, and the department of
14 archaeology and historic preservation, shall establish and submit a
15 prioritized list of heritage capital projects to the governor and the
16 legislature in the society's biennial capital budget request. The
17 list shall include a description of each project, the amount of
18 recommended state funding, and documentation of nonstate funds to be
19 used for the project. The total amount of recommended state funding
20 for projects on a biennial project list shall not exceed ten million
21 dollars. The prioritized list shall be developed through open and
22 public meetings and the amount of state funding shall not exceed
23 thirty-three and thirty-three one hundredths percent of the total
24 cost of the project. The nonstate portion of the total project cost
25 may include cash, the value of real property when acquired solely for
26 the purpose of the project, and in-kind contributions. The department
27 shall not sign contracts or otherwise financially obligate funds
28 under this section until the legislature has approved a specific list
29 of projects. In contracts for grants authorized under this section,
30 the society shall include provisions requiring that capital
31 improvements be held by the grantee for a specified period of time
32 appropriate to the amount of the grant and that facilities be used
33 for the express purpose of the grant. If the grantee is found to be
34 out of compliance with provisions of the contract, the grantee shall
35 repay to the state general fund the principal amount of the grant
36 plus interest calculated at the rate of interest on state of
37 Washington general obligation bonds issued most closely to the date
38 of authorization of the grant.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** To carry out the provisions of this
2 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design,
3 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012.** If any federal moneys appropriated by
5 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the
6 department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may
7 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local
8 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the
9 prior approval of the director of financial management in
10 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house
11 of representatives capital budget committee.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7013.** (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all
13 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money

29 account and the outdoor recreation account.

31 million dollars, the money must be allocated as follows: (i) Twenty
32 million dollars to the habitat conservation account and twenty
33 million dollars to the outdoor recreation account; (ii) any amount

9 (i) Two million six hundred ninety-five thousand dollars to the
10 farmland preservation account;

11 (ii) Four million seven hundred sixty-six thousand dollars to the
12 riparian easement account;

13 (iii) The balance of the appropriation to the outdoor recreation
14 account.

15 (2) Except as otherwise provided in chapter 303, Laws of 2005,
16 moneys deposited in these accounts shall be invested as authorized
17 for other state funds, and any earnings on them shall be credited to
18 the respective account.

19 (3) All moneys deposited in the habitat conservation, outdoor
20 recreation, riparian protection, and farmlands preservation accounts
21 shall be allocated as provided under RCW 79A.15.040, 79A.15.050,
22 79A.15.120, and 79A.15.130 as grants to state or local agencies or
23 nonprofit nature conservancy organizations or associations for
24 acquisition, development, and renovation within the jurisdiction of
25 those agencies, subject to legislative appropriation. The board may
26 use or permit the use of any funds appropriated for this chapter as
27 matching funds where federal, local, or other funds are made
28 available for projects within the purposes of this chapter. Moneys
29 appropriated to these accounts that are not obligated to a specific
30 project may be used to fund projects from lists of alternate projects
31 from the same account in biennia succeeding the biennium in which the

33 (4) Projects receiving grants under this chapter that are
34 developed or otherwise accessible for public recreational uses shall
35 be available to the public.

36 (5) The board may make grants to an eligible project from the
37 habitat conservation, outdoor recreation, riparian protection, and
38 farmlands preservation accounts and any one or more of the applicable
39 categories under such accounts described in RCW 79A.15.040,
40 79A.15.050, 79A.15.120, and 79A.15.130.

1 (6) The board may accept private donations to the habitat
2 conservation account, the outdoor recreation account, the riparian
3 protection account, and the farmlands preservation account for the
4 purposes specified in this chapter.

5 (7) The board may apply up to three percent of the funds
6 appropriated for this chapter for its office for the administration
7 of the programs and purposes specified in this chapter.

8 (8) Habitat and recreation land and facilities acquired or
9 developed with moneys appropriated for this chapter may not, without
10 prior approval of the board, be converted to a use other than that
11 for which funds were originally approved. The board shall adopt rules
12 and procedures governing the approval of such a conversion.

13 **Sec. 7015.** RCW 79A.15.050 and 2007 c 241 s 30 are each amended
14 to read as follows:

15 (1) Moneys appropriated for this chapter to the outdoor
16 recreation account shall be distributed in the following way:

17 (a) Not less than thirty percent to the state parks and
18 recreation commission for the acquisition and development of state
19 parks, with at least fifty percent of the money for acquisition
20 costs; however, during the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, the amount
21 allocated to the state parks and recreation commission must be zero.
22 The legislature intends to appropriate money for state park
23 development projects through the state parks and recreation
24 commission capital budget to ensure transparency and coordination
25 with other capital budget appropriations for state parks;

26 (b) Not less than thirty percent for the acquisition,
27 development, and renovation of local parks, with at least fifty
28 percent of this money for acquisition costs; however, during the
29 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, the allocation to local parks must be that
30 balance of the outdoor recreation account after deducting the amounts

33 the prioritized list of projects prepared by the board without regard
34 to whether they are development or acquisition;

35 (c) Not less than twenty percent for the acquisition, renovation,
36 or development of trails; however, during the 2015-2017 fiscal
37 biennium, the allocation for the acquisition, renovation and
38 development of trails must be twelve million one hundred eighty
39 thousand dollars;

1 (d) Not less than fifteen percent for the acquisition,
2 renovation, or development of water access sites, with at least
3 seventy-five percent of this money for acquisition costs; however,
4 during the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, the allocation for the

9 (b) Funds for plans and programs must be allocated consistent
10 with the priorities and matching requirements established in chapters
11 70.105, 70.95C, 70.95I, and 70.95 RCW.

12 (c) During the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, the local toxics
13 control account may also be used for local government storm water
14 planning and implementation activities.

15 (d) During the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, the legislature may
16 transfer from the local toxics control account to the state general
17 fund, such amounts as reflect the excess fund balance in the account.

18 (e) To expedite cleanups throughout the state, the department may
19 use the following strategies when providing grants to local
20 governments under this subsection:

21 (i) Enter into an extended grant agreement with a local
22 government conducting remedial actions at a facility where those
23 actions extend over multiple biennia and the total eligible cost of

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7027. (1) Funds appropriated in this act for
6 minor works may not be allotted until final project lists are
7 submitted to the office of financial management. Revisions to the
8 project lists are allowed for projects not anticipated at the time of
9 budget development but must be submitted to the office of financial
10 management, the house of representatives capital budget committee,
11 and the senate ways and means committee for review and comment and
12 must include an explanation of variances from the prior lists before
13 funds may be expended on the revisions. Any project list revisions
14 must be approved by the office of financial management before funds
15 may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

16 (2)(a) Minor works project lists are single line appropriations

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7029.** RESEARCH ON TRANSFER OF FEDERAL LANDS

6 committees shall use existing studies and available literature to
7 research the potential costs, revenues, and policy impacts of
8 transferring federal lands to state ownership. The research must
9 include:

10 (1) Costs to the state of: (a) Land management related to
11 wildfires, forest health, invasive species management, and public
12 access; (b) addressing deferred forest health issues and ongoing

25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7030.** (1) The legislature recognizes that
26 school districts are responsible for siting, building, and
27 maintaining school facilities that provide a learning environment
28 supportive of student achievement, and that schools are integral to
29 the communities they serve. The legislature intends to create the
30 legislative task force on school siting, as provided in subsection
31 (2) of this section, to review school facility challenges created by
32 enrollment increases and recent education reforms, including
33 expansion of full-day kindergarten and smaller class sizes.

34 (2) A legislative task force on school siting is established,
35 with members as provided in this subsection. All member appointments
36 or selections must be made by July 1, 2015.

12 (iii) Two representatives of school districts, who represent
13 school districts that serve students in urban areas and currently are
14 experiencing difficulty finding suitable siting locations, selected
15 by the Washington association of school administrators;

16 (iv) Two representatives of school districts, who represent
17 school districts that serve students in rural areas and currently are
18 experiencing difficulty finding suitable siting locations, selected
19 by the Washington association of school administrators; and

20 (v) A representative of the Washington state association of
21 county and regional planning directors.

22 (3) The task force shall choose its chair from among its
23 legislative membership. The chair shall convene at least three
24 meetings of the task force.

25 (4) The task force shall review the issue of siting schools
26 inside and outside of urban growth areas. In reviewing this issue,
27 the task force must balance the planning goals and requirements set
28 forth in chapter 36.70A RCW with the needs of school districts facing
29 capacity issues and the infrastructure needs of local governments.

30 (5) Staff from the office of superintendent of public instruction
31 and from affected school districts, counties, and cities must support
32 the task force by providing local information as needed. Support
33 provided by staff from the office of superintendent of public
34 instruction must be provided within existing resources.

35 (6) Staff support for the task force must be provided by senate
36 committee services and the house of representatives office of program
37 research.

38 (7) Legislative members of the task force must be reimbursed for
39 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative
40 members, except those representing an employer or organization, are

1 entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW
2 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

3 (8) The expenses of the task force must be paid jointly by the
4 senate and the house of representatives. Task force expenditures are
5 subject to approval by the senate facilities and operations committee
6 and the house of representatives executive rules committee, or their
7 successor committees.

8 (9) The task force shall provide a summary of the task force's
9 discussions and any recommendations to the appropriate committees of
10 the legislature by December 1, 2015.

11 (10) This section expires January 1, 2016.

12 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7031.** A legislative task force is established
13 to work with the department of enterprise services and the state
14 building code council, within existing funding, to study all aspects
15 of the council's administration and operations for managing and
16 conducting updates to the codes specified in chapters 19.27 and
17 19.27A RCW.

18 (a) The membership of the task force must be comprised of the
19 four ex officio legislative members assigned to the council, two
20 members of the department of enterprise services, four members of the
21 council, of which two represent local government, with one local
22 government member representing building code enforcement officials,
23 and a variety of stakeholders who work with the council on a regular
24 basis. The task force, at a minimum, must:

25 (i) Consult with other directors and representatives of state
26 agencies who interact with the council;

27 (ii) Gather input from current councilmembers and former members
28 who recently served on the council;

29 (iii) Review past legislation and other documents regarding the
30 function of the council; and

31 (iv) Study the workforce level needed for rule making, conducting
32 stakeholder processes, holding open meetings, processing code
33 amendments, and addressing policy issues for the codes the
34 legislature has charged the council to maintain.

35 (b) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the
36 capital budget staff of senate committee services and the office of
37 program research.

38 (c) By December 18, 2015, and in compliance with RCW 43.01.036,
39 any findings and recommendations made by the task force must be

1 reported to the governor and the appropriate committees of the
2 legislature. If work cannot be completed by December 18, 2015, a
3 report on the status of the task force work must be provided with any
4 recommended actions followed by a second report that must be
5 submitted to the governor and the appropriate committees of the
6 legislature by December 16, 2016.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7032.** This act is necessary for the immediate
8 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
9 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
10 effect immediately."
