1 AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and
2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW
3 70.340.130, 28B.10.027, 28B.20.725, 28B.30.750, 28B.15.210,
4 28B.15.310, 28B.35.370, 28B.50.360, 70.105D.070, 79A.15.030,
5 79A.15.050, and 79A.15.130; amending 2015 3rd sp.s. c 3 ss 1002,
6 1026, 1028, 6005, 3128, 3118, 3097, 3098, 3101, 3130, 3119, 3198,
7 3200, 3202, 3204, 3197, and 3187 (uncodified); amending 2016 sp.s. c
8 35 ss 1012, 1015, 2011, 3018, 3026, 5004, and 6015 (uncodified);
9 reenacting and amending RCW 43.155.050; adding new sections to 2015
10 3rd sp.s. c 3 (uncodified); creating new sections; making
11 appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

13 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted
14 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several
15 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be
16 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby
17 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects
18 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and
19 ending June 30, 2019, out of the several funds specified in this act.

20 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
21 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

1 (a) "Fiscal year 2018" or "FY 2018" means the period beginning
2 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018.

3 (b) "Fiscal year 2019" or "FY 2019" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019.

5 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an
6 unappropriated status.

7 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent
8 only for the specified purpose.

9 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any
10 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is
11 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to
12 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

13 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future
14 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only
15 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior
16 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for
17 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of
18 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what
19 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2019-2021
20 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not
21 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
22 the project or program in the future.

23 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless
24 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant
25 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations.
26 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances
27 remaining on June 30, 2017, from previous biennial appropriations for
28 each project.

31 (b) \$10,000,000 is provided solely for housing preservation
32 grants to be awarded competitively. The grants may be provided for
33 major building improvements, preservation, and system replacements,
34 necessary for the existing housing trust fund portfolio to maintain
35 long-term viability. The department must require that a capital needs

1 assessment is performed to estimate the cost of the preservation
2 project at contract execution. Funds may not be used to add or expand
3 the capacity of the property. To receive grants, housing projects
4 must meet the following requirements:

5 (i) The property is more than fifteen years old;

6 (ii) At least 50 percent of the housing units are occupied by
7 families and individuals at or below 30 percent annual median income.

8 (iii) The improvements will result in reduction of operating or
9 utilities costs, or both; and

10 (iv) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to
11 achieve the purpose of this program.

12 (c) \$5,000,000 is provided solely for housing projects that
13 benefit people at or below 90 percent of the annual median income who
14 have been displaced by a natural disaster declared by the governor,
15 including people who have been displaced within the last two biennia.

16 (d) \$1,000,000 of the Washington housing trust account—state
17 appropriation is provided solely for the department to work with the
18 communities of concern commission to focus on creating capital assets
19 that will help reduce poverty and build stronger and more sustainable
20 communities using the communities' cultural understanding and vision.
21 The funding must be used for predevelopment costs for capital
22 projects identified by the commission and for other activities to
23 assist communities in developing capacity to create community-owned
24 capital assets.

25 (e) \$10,098,000 is provided solely for the following list of
26 housing projects:

27 (i) Cross-Laminated Timber Spokane Housing Predesign. . . \$500,000

28 (ii) El Centro de la Raza. \$737,000

33 (f) Of the amounts appropriated remaining after (a) through (e)
34 of this subsection, the department must allocate the funds as
35 follows:

36 (i) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
37 benefit veterans;

38 (ii) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
39 benefit homeownership;

1 (iii) 5 percent is provided solely for housing projects that
2 benefit people with developmental disabilities;

3 (iv) 5 percent is provided solely for grants for high quality
4 low-income housing projects that quickly move people from
5 homelessness into secure housing and are significantly less expensive
6 to construct than traditional housing. In awarding grants, the
7 department must prioritize projects that:

8 (A) Provide permanent, high-quality housing or safe, lockable
9 temporary shelter structures that provide significantly greater
10 safety and security than tents;

11 (B) Serve chronically homeless adults or people being discharged
12 from inpatient mental health or addiction treatment;

13 (C) Offer a community setting that supports residents' transition
14 to stability and self-determination; and

15 (D) Site the housing on under-utilized public land; and

16 (v) The remaining amount is provided solely for projects that
17 serve low-income and special needs populations in need of housing,
18 including, but not limited to, homeless families with children,
19 homeless youth, farmworkers, and seniors.

20 (2) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must
21 give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria
22 in RCW 43.185.070(5).

23 (3) The department must strive to allocate all of the amounts
24 appropriated in this section within the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium in
25 the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section. However, if
26 upon review of applications the department determines there are not
27 adequate suitable projects in a category, the department may allocate
28 funds to projects serving other low-income and special needs
29 populations, provided those projects are located in an area with an
30 identified need for the type of housing proposed.

21 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most
22 reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop
23 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The
24 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital
25 costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs
26 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further
27 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is

1 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural
2 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition
3 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional
4 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

5 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate
6 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and
7 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever
8 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7009.** (1) Any building project that receives
10 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to
11 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that
12 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building
13 attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle
14 performance, and occupant productivity. The following design and
15 construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

16 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative,
17 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains
18 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and
19 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water,
20 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other
21 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals
22 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Considers all
23 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction.

24 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the
25 size and complexity of the building and its system components in
26 order to verify performance of building components and systems and
27 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an
28 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning
29 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,
30 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
31 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

32 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building
33 performance target that takes into account the intended use,
34 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design
35 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major
36 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy
37 use index. For major renovations, reduce the energy use by fifty
38 percent below prerenovations baseline.

1 (d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the
2 hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters,
3 when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation
4 projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost
5 effective.

6 (e) Measurement and verification: Install building level
7 electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects
8 to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent
9 meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are
10 used. Install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize
11 occupants on energy use.

12 (f) Benchmarking: Compare actual performance data from the first
13 year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the
14 building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other
15 building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool for
16 laboratory buildings. Web-based data collection and dashboards must
17 also be provided.

18 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7010.** State agencies, including institutions
19 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent
20 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting
21 for operating expenditures.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7011.** Executive Order No. 05-05,
23 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November
24 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in
25 this executive order.

26 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7012.** FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
27 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
28 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
29 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

30 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
31 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work
32 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for
33 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

34 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
35 for original construction of any public building by a state agency
36 identified in RCW 43.17.020 is provided solely for the purposes of
37 RCW 43.17.200.

1 (4) At least eighty-five percent of the moneys spent by the
2 Washington state arts commission during the 2017-2019 biennium for
3 the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be
4 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art. Art
5 allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will lapse.
6 The commission may use up to \$150,000 of this amount to conserve or
7 maintain existing pieces in the state art collection pursuant to RCW
8 28A.335.210.

9 (5) The executive director of the arts commission shall appoint a
10 study group to review the operations of the one-half of one percent
11 for works of art purchased or commissioned as required by RCW
12 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200. The findings of the review
13 must be reported annually to the office of financial management and
14 the fiscal committees of the legislature by September 15th. The
15 review must include, but is not limited to, the following: (a)
16 Projects purchased or commissioned per biennium; (b) partner
17 agencies; (c) funding sources by fiscal year; (d) artwork costs; (e)
18 administrative costs; (f) collection care costs; and (g) project
19 status.

21 toxics control account: (i) The costs of remedial actions recovered
22 under this chapter or chapter 70.105A RCW; (ii) penalties collected
23 or recovered under this chapter; and (iii) any other money
24 appropriated or transferred to the account by the legislature.

25 (3) Moneys in the state toxics control account must be used only
26 to carry out the purposes of this chapter, including but not limited
27 to the following activities:

28 (a) The state's responsibility for hazardous waste planning,
29 management, regulation, enforcement, technical assistance, and public
30 education required under chapter 70.105 RCW;

31 (b) The state's responsibility for solid waste planning,
32 management, regulation, enforcement, technical assistance, and public
33 education required under chapter 70.95 RCW;

34 (c) The hazardous waste clean-up program required under this
35 chapter;

36 (d) State matching funds required under federal cleanup law;

37 (e) Financial assistance for local programs in accordance with
38 chapters 70.95, 70.95C, 70.95I, and 70.105 RCW;

1 (f) State government programs for the safe reduction, recycling,
2 or disposal of paint and hazardous wastes from households, small
3 businesses, and agriculture;

4 (g) Oil and hazardous materials spill prevention, preparedness,
5 training, and response activities;

6 (h) Water and environmental health protection and monitoring
7 programs;

8 (i) Programs authorized under chapter 70.146 RCW;

9 (j) A public participation program;

10 (k) Public funding to assist potentially liable persons to pay
11 for the costs of remedial action in compliance with clean-up
12 standards under RCW 70.105D.030(2)(e) but only when the amount and
13 terms of such funding are established under a settlement agreement
14 under RCW 70.105D.040(4) and when the director has found that the
15 funding will achieve both: (i) A substantially more expeditious or
16 enhanced cleanup than would otherwise occur; and (ii) the prevention
17 or mitigation of unfair economic hardship;

18 (l) Development and demonstration of alternative management
19 technologies designed to carry out the hazardous waste management
20 priorities of RCW 70.105.150;

21 (m) State agriculture and health programs for the safe use,
22 reduction, recycling, or disposal of pesticides;

23 (n) Storm water pollution control projects and activities that
24 protect or preserve existing remedial actions or prevent hazardous
25 clean-up sites;

26 (o) Funding requirements to maintain receipt of federal funds
27 under the federal solid waste disposal act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 6901 et
28 seq.);

29 (p) Air quality programs and actions for reducing public exposure
30 to toxic air pollution;

31 (q) Public funding to assist prospective purchasers to pay for
32 the costs of remedial action in compliance with clean-up standards
33 under RCW 70.105D.030(2)(e) if:

34 (i) The facility is located within a redevelopment opportunity
35 zone designated under RCW 70.105D.150;

36 (ii) The amount and terms of the funding are established under a
37 settlement agreement under RCW 70.105D.040(5); and

38 (iii) The director has found the funding meets any additional
39 criteria established in rule by the department, will achieve a
40 substantially more expeditious or enhanced cleanup than would

1 otherwise occur, and will provide a public benefit in addition to
2 cleanup commensurate with the scope of the public funding;

3 (r) Petroleum-based plastic or expanded polystyrene foam debris
4 cleanup activities in fresh or marine waters;

5 (s) Appropriations to the local toxics control account or the
6 environmental legacy stewardship account created in RCW 70.105D.170,
7 if the legislature determines that priorities for spending exceed
8 available funds in those accounts;

9 (t) During the 2013-2015 and 2015-2017 fiscal biennia, the
10 department of ecology's water quality, shorelands, environmental
11 assessment, administration, and air quality programs;

12 (u) During the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, actions at the state
13 conservation commission to improve water quality for shellfish;

14 (v) During the 2013-2015 and 2015-2017 fiscal biennia, actions at
15 the University of Washington for reducing ocean acidification;

16 (w) During the 2015-2017 and 2017-2019 fiscal (~~biennium~~)
17 biennia, for the University of Washington Tacoma soil remediation
18 project;

19 (x) For the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, moneys in the state toxics
20 control account may be spent on projects in section 3160, chapter 19,
21 Laws of 2013 2nd sp. sess. and for transfer to the local toxics
22 control account;

23 (y) For the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, moneys in the state toxics
24 control account may be transferred to the radioactive mixed waste
25 account; and

26 (z) For the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, forest practices
27 regulation at the department of natural resources.

28 (4)(a) The department shall use moneys deposited in the local
29 toxics control account for grants or loans to local governments for
30 the following purposes in descending order of priority:

31 (i) Extended grant agreements entered into under (e)(i) of this
32 subsection;

33 (ii) Remedial actions, including planning for adaptive reuse of
34 properties as provided for under (e)(iv) of this subsection. The
35 department must prioritize funding of remedial actions at:

36 (A) Facilities on the department's hazardous sites list with a
37 high hazard ranking for which there is an approved remedial action
38 work plan or an equivalent document under federal cleanup law;

39 (B) Brownfield properties within a redevelopment opportunity zone
40 if the local government is a prospective purchaser of the property

1 and there is a department-approved remedial action work plan or
2 equivalent document under the federal cleanup law;

3 (iii) Storm water pollution source projects that: (A) Work in
4 conjunction with a remedial action; (B) protect completed remedial
5 actions against recontamination; or (C) prevent hazardous clean-up
6 sites;

7 (iv) Hazardous waste plans and programs under chapter 70.105 RCW;

8 (v) Solid waste plans and programs under chapters 70.95, 70.95C,
9 70.95I, and 70.105 RCW;

10 (vi) Petroleum-based plastic or expanded polystyrene foam debris
11 cleanup activities in fresh or marine waters; and

12 (vii) Appropriations to the state toxics control account or the
13 environmental legacy stewardship account created in RCW 70.105D.170,
14 if the legislature determines that priorities for spending exceed
15 available funds in those accounts.

16 (b) Funds for plans and programs must be allocated consistent
17 with the priorities and matching requirements established in chapters
18 70.105, 70.95C, 70.95I, and 70.95 RCW.

19 (c) During the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, the local toxics
20 control account may also be used for local government storm water
21 planning and implementation activities.

22 (d) During the 2013-2015 fiscal biennium, the legislature may
23 transfer from the local toxics control account to the state general
24 fund, such amounts as reflect the excess fund balance in the account.

25 (e) To expedite cleanups throughout the state, the department may
26 use the following strategies when providing grants to local
27 governments under this subsection:

28 (i) Enter into an extended grant agreement with a local
29 government conducting remedial actions at a facility where those
30 actions extend over multiple biennia and the total eligible cost of
31 those actions exceeds twenty million dollars. The agreement is
32 subject to the following limitations:

33 (A) The initial duration of such an agreement may not exceed ten
34 years. The department may extend the duration of such an agreement
35 upon finding substantial progress has been made on remedial actions
36 at the facility;

37 (B) Extended grant agreements may not exceed fifty percent of the
38 total eligible remedial action costs at the facility; and

39 (C) The department may not allocate future funding to an extended
40 grant agreement unless the local government has demonstrated to the

1 department that funds awarded under the agreement during the previous
2 biennium have been substantially expended or contracts have been
3 entered into to substantially expend the funds;

4 (ii) Enter into a grant agreement with a local government
5 conducting a remedial action that provides for periodic reimbursement
6 of remedial action costs as they are incurred as established in the
7 agreement;

8 (iii) Enter into a grant agreement with a local government prior
9 to it acquiring a property or obtaining necessary access to conduct
10 remedial actions, provided the agreement is conditioned upon the
11 local government acquiring the property or obtaining the access in
12 accordance with a schedule specified in the agreement;

13 (iv) Provide integrated planning grants to local governments to
14 fund studies necessary to facilitate remedial actions at brownfield
15 properties and adaptive reuse of properties following remediation.
16 Eligible activities include, but are not limited to: Environmental
17 site assessments; remedial investigations; health assessments;
18 feasibility studies; site planning; community involvement; land use
19 and regulatory analyses; building and infrastructure assessments;
20 economic and fiscal analyses; and any environmental analyses under
21 chapter 43.21C RCW;

22 (v) Provide grants to local governments for remedial actions
23 related to area-wide groundwater contamination. To receive the
24 funding, the local government does not need to be a potentially
25 liable person or be required to seek reimbursement of grant funds
26 from a potentially liable person;

27 (vi) The director may alter grant matching requirements to create
28 incentives for local governments to expedite cleanups when one of the
29 following conditions exists:

30 (A) Funding would prevent or mitigate unfair economic hardship
31 imposed by the clean-up liability;

32 (B) Funding would create new substantial economic development,
33 public recreational opportunities, or habitat restoration
34 opportunities that would not otherwise occur; or

35 (C) Funding would create an opportunity for acquisition and
36 redevelopment of brownfield property under RCW 70.105D.040(5) that
37 would not otherwise occur;

38 (vii) When pending grant applications under (e)(iv) and (v) of
39 this subsection (4) exceed the amount of funds available, designated

1 redevelopment opportunity zones must receive priority for
2 distribution of available funds.

3 (f) To expedite multiparty clean-up efforts, the department may
4 purchase remedial action cost-cap insurance. For the 2013-2015 fiscal
5 biennium, moneys in the local toxics control account may be spent on
6 projects in sections 3024, 3035, 3036, and 3059, chapter 19, Laws of
7 2013 2nd sp. sess.

8 (5) Except for unanticipated receipts under RCW 43.79.260 through
9 43.79.282, moneys in the state and local toxics control accounts may
10 be spent only after appropriation by statute.

11 (6) No moneys deposited into either the state or local toxics
12 control account may be used for: Natural disasters where there is no
13 hazardous substance contamination; high performance buildings; solid
14 waste incinerator facility feasibility studies, construction,
15 maintenance, or operation; or after January 1, 2010, for projects
16 designed to address the restoration of Puget Sound, funded in a
17 competitive grant process, that are in conflict with the action
18 agenda developed by the Puget Sound partnership under RCW 90.71.310.
19 However, this subsection does not prevent an appropriation from the
20 state toxics control account to the department of revenue to enforce
21 compliance with the hazardous substance tax imposed in chapter 82.21
22 RCW.

23 (7) Except during (~~the 2011-2013 and~~) the 2015-2017 and the
24 2017-2019 fiscal biennia, one percent of the moneys collected under
25 RCW 82.21.030 shall be allocated only for public participation grants
26 to persons who may be adversely affected by a release or threatened
27 release of a hazardous substance and to not-for-profit public
28 interest organizations. The primary purpose of these grants is to
29 facilitate the participation by persons and organizations in the
30 investigation and remedying of releases or threatened releases of
31 hazardous substances and to implement the state's solid and hazardous
32 waste management priorities. No grant may exceed sixty thousand
33 dollars. Grants may be renewed annually. Moneys appropriated for
34 public participation that are not expended at the close of any
35 biennium revert to the state toxics control account.

36 (8) The department shall adopt rules for grant or loan issuance
37 and performance. To accelerate both remedial action and economic
38 recovery, the department may expedite the adoption of rules necessary
39 to implement chapter 1, Laws of 2013 2nd sp. sess. using the
40 expedited procedures in RCW 34.05.353. The department shall initiate

1 the award of financial assistance by August 1, 2013. To ensure the
2 adoption of rules will not delay financial assistance, the department
3 may administer the award of financial assistance through interpretive
4 guidance pending the adoption of rules through July 1, 2014.

5 (9) Except as provided under subsection (3)(k) and (q) of this
6 section, nothing in chapter 1, Laws of 2013 2nd sp. sess. affects the
7 ability of a potentially liable person to receive public funding.

8 (10) During the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium the local toxics
9 control account may also be used for the centennial clean water
10 program and for the storm water financial assistance program
11 administered by the department of ecology.

12 (11) During the 2017-2019 biennium the state toxics control
13 account, the local toxics control account, and the environmental
14 legacy stewardship account may be used for interchangeable purposes
15 and funds may be transferred between accounts to accomplish those
16 purposes.

17 **Sec. 7027.** RCW 79A.15.030 and 2016 c 149 s 3 are each amended to
18 read as follows:

19 (1) Moneys appropriated prior to July 1, 2016, for this chapter
20 shall be divided as follows:

21 (a) Appropriations for a biennium of forty million dollars or
22 less must be allocated equally between the habitat conservation
23 account and the outdoor recreation account.

24 (b) If appropriations for a biennium total more than forty
25 million dollars, the money must be allocated as follows: (i) Twenty
26 million dollars to the habitat conservation account and twenty
27 million dollars to the outdoor recreation account; (ii) any amount
28 over forty million dollars up to fifty million dollars shall be
29 allocated as follows: (A) Ten percent to the habitat conservation
30 account; (B) ten percent to the outdoor recreation account; (C) forty
31 percent to the riparian protection account; and (D) forty percent to
32 the farmlands preservation account; and (iii) any amounts over fifty
33 million dollars must be allocated as follows: (A) Thirty percent to
34 the habitat conservation account; (B) thirty percent to the outdoor

36 account; and (D) ten percent to the farmlands preservation account.

37 (2) Beginning July 1, 2016, moneys appropriated for this chapter
38 must be allocated as follows: (a) Forty-five percent to the habitat
39 conservation account; (b) forty-five percent to the outdoor

1 recreation account; and (c) ten percent to the farm and forest
2 account. However, for the 2017-2019 biennium, moneys appropriated for
3 this chapter must be allocated as specified in section 3183 of this
4 act.

5 (3) Moneys deposited in these accounts shall be invested as
6 authorized for other state funds, and any earnings on them shall be
7 credited to the respective account.

8 (4) All moneys deposited in the habitat conservation, outdoor
9 recreation, and farm and forest accounts shall be allocated as
10 provided under RCW 79A.15.040, 79A.15.050, and 79A.15.130 as grants
11 to state or local agencies or nonprofit nature conservancies for
12 acquisition, development, and renovation within the jurisdiction of
13 those agencies, subject to legislative appropriation. The board may
14 use or permit the use of any funds appropriated for this chapter as
15 matching funds where federal, local, or other funds are made
16 available for projects within the purposes of this chapter. Moneys
17 appropriated to these accounts that are not obligated to a specific
18 project may be used to fund projects from lists of alternate projects
19 from the same account in biennia succeeding the biennium in which the
20 moneys were originally appropriated.

21 (5) Projects receiving grants for development, recreational
22 access, or fee simple acquisition of land under this chapter must be
23 accessible for public recreation and outdoor education unless the
24 board specifically approves limiting public access in order to
25 protect sensitive species, water quality, or public safety.

26 (6) The board may make grants to an eligible project from the
27 habitat conservation, outdoor recreation, and farm and forest
28 accounts and any one or more of the applicable categories under such
29 accounts described in RCW 79A.15.040, 79A.15.050, and 79A.15.130.

30 (7) The board may accept private donations to the habitat
31 conservation account, the outdoor recreation account, and the farm
32 and forest account for the purposes specified in this chapter.

33 (8) The board may retain a portion of the funds appropriated for
34 this chapter for its office for the administration of the programs
35 and purposes specified in this chapter. The portion of the funds
36 retained for administration may not exceed: (a) The actual
37 administration costs averaged over the previous five biennia as a
38 percentage of the legislature's new appropriation for this chapter;
39 or (b) the amount specified in the appropriation, if any. Each
40 biennium the percentage specified under (a) of this subsection must

1 be approved by the office of financial management and submitted along
2 with the prioritized lists of projects to be funded in RCW
3 79A.15.060, 79A.15.070, and 79A.15.130.

4 (9) Habitat and recreation land and facilities acquired or
5 developed with moneys appropriated for this chapter may not, without
6 prior approval of the board, be converted to a use other than that
7 for which funds were originally approved. The board shall adopt rules
8 and procedures governing the approval of such a conversion.

9 **Sec. 7028.** RCW 79A.15.050 and 2016 c 149 s 5 are each amended to
10 read as follows:

11 (1) Moneys appropriated prior to July 1, 2016, for this chapter
12 to the outdoor recreation account shall be distributed in the
13 following way:

14 (a) Not less than thirty percent to the state parks and
15 recreation commission for the acquisition and development of state
16 parks, with at least fifty percent of the money for acquisition
17 costs;

18 (b) Not less than thirty percent for the acquisition,
19 development, and renovation of local parks, with at least fifty
20 percent of this money for acquisition costs;

21 (c) Not less than twenty percent for the acquisition, renovation,

35 parks, with at least forty percent but no more than fifty percent of
36 the money for acquisition costs;

1 percent but no more than fifty percent of this money for acquisition

14 and water access sites, and is not required to meet the percentages
15 described in subsections (1) and (2) of this section in any one
16 biennium. However, for the 2017-2019 biennium, moneys appropriated
17 for this chapter must be allocated as specified in section 3183 of
18 this act.

19 (b) If not enough project applications are submitted in a
20 category within the outdoor recreation account to meet the
21 percentages described in subsections (1) and (2) of this section in
22 any biennium, the board retains discretion to distribute any
23 remaining funds to the other categories within the account.

24 (4) Only the state parks and recreation commission may apply for
25 acquisition and development funds for state parks under subsections
26 (1)(a) and (2)(a) of this section.

27 (5) Only local agencies may apply for acquisition, development,
28 or renovation funds for local parks under subsections (1)(b) and
29 (2)(b) of this section.

30 (6) Only state and local agencies may apply for funds for trails
31 under subsections (1)(c) and (2)(c) of this section.

32 (7) Only state and local agencies may apply for funds for water
33 access sites under subsections (1)(d) and (2)(d) of this section.

34 (8) Only the department of natural resources and the department
35 of fish and wildlife may apply for funds for development and
36 renovation projects on existing state recreation lands under
37 subsections (1)(e) and (2)(e) of this section.

38 **Sec. 7029.** RCW 79A.15.130 and 2016 c 149 s 10 are each amended
39 to read as follows:

1 (1) The farm and forest account is established in the state
2 treasury. The board will administer the account in accordance with
3 chapter 79A.25 RCW and this chapter, and hold it separate and apart
4 from all other money, funds, and accounts of the board. Moneys
5 appropriated for this chapter to the farm and forest account must be
6 distributed for the acquisition and preservation of farmlands and
7 forestlands in order to maintain the opportunity for agricultural and
8 forest management activity upon these lands.

9 (2) Moneys appropriated beginning July 1, 2016, for this chapter
10 shall be divided as follows:

11 (a) Not less than ninety percent for the acquisition and
12 preservation of farmlands.

13 (b) Not less than ten percent for the acquisition and
14 preservation of forestlands.

15 (c) However, for the 2017-2019 biennium, moneys appropriated for
16 this chapter must be allocated as specified in section 3183 of this
17 act.

18 (3) Moneys appropriated for this chapter to the farm and forest
19 account may be distributed for: (a) The acquisition of a less than
20 fee simple interest in farmlands or forestland, such as a
21 conservation easement or lease; (b) the enhancement or restoration of
22 ecological functions on those properties; or (c) both. In order for a
23 farmland or forestland preservation grant to provide for an
24 environmental enhancement or restoration project, the project must
25 include the acquisition of a real property interest.

26 (4) Cities, counties, nonprofit nature conservancies, and the
27 conservation commission may apply for acquisition and enhancement or
28 restoration funds for farmland or forestland preservation projects
29 within their jurisdictions under subsection (1) of this section.

30 (5) The board may adopt rules establishing acquisition and
31 enhancement or restoration policies and priorities for distributions
32 from the farm and forest account.

33 (6) The acquisition of a property interest in a project under
34 this section does not provide a right of access to the property by
35 the public unless explicitly provided for in a conservation easement
36 or other form of deed restriction.

37 (7) Except as provided in RCW 79A.15.030(8), moneys appropriated
38 for this section may not be used by the board to fund staff positions
39 or other overhead expenses, or by cities, counties, nonprofit nature

1 conservancies, or the conservation commission to fund operation or
2 maintenance of areas acquired under this chapter.

3 (8) Moneys appropriated for this section may be used by grant
4 recipients for costs incidental to restoration and acquisition,
5 including, but not limited to, surveying expenses, fencing, noxious

7 (9) The board may not approve a local project where the local
8 agency's or nonprofit nature conservancies' share is less than the
9 amount to be awarded from the farm and forest account. In-kind
10 contributions, including contributions of a real property interest in
11 land, may be used to satisfy the local agency's or nonprofit nature
12 conservancies' share.

13 (10) In determining the acquisition priorities for farmland
14 projects, the board must consider, at a minimum, the following
15 criteria:

16 (a) Community support for the project;

17 (b) A recommendation as part of a limiting factors or critical
18 pathways analysis, a watershed plan or habitat conservation plan, or
19 a coordinated regionwide prioritization effort;

20 (c) The likelihood of the conversion of the site to
21 nonagricultural or more highly developed usage;

22 (d) Consistency with a local land use plan, or a regional or
23 statewide recreational or resource plan. The projects that assist in
24 the implementation of local shoreline master plans updated according
25 to RCW 90.58.080 or local comprehensive plans updated according to
26 RCW 36.70A.130 must be highly considered in the process;

27 (e) Benefits to salmonids;

28 (f) Benefits to other fish and wildlife habitat;

29 (g) Integration with recovery efforts for endangered, threatened,
30 or sensitive species;

31 (h) The viability of the site for continued agricultural
32 production, including, but not limited to:

33 (i) Soil types;

34 (ii) On-site production and support facilities such as barns,
35 irrigation systems, crop processing and storage facilities, wells,
36 housing, livestock sheds, and other farming infrastructure;

37 (iii) Suitability for producing different types or varieties of
38 crops;

39 (iv) Farm-to-market access;

40 (v) Water availability; and

1 (i) Other community values provided by the property when used as
2 agricultural land, including, but not limited to:

3 (i) Viewshed;

4 (ii) Aquifer recharge;

5 (iii) Occasional or periodic collector for storm water runoff;

6 (iv) Agricultural sector job creation;

7 (v) Migratory bird habitat and forage area; and

8 (vi) Educational and curriculum potential.

9 (11) In allotting funds for environmental enhancement or
10 restoration projects, the board will require the projects to meet the
11 following criteria:

12 (a) Enhancement or restoration projects must further the
13 ecological functions of the farmlands;

14 (b) The projects, such as fencing, bridging watercourses,
15 replanting native vegetation, replacing culverts, clearing of
16 waterways, etc., must be less than fifty percent of the acquisition
17 cost of the project including any in-kind contribution by any party;

18 (c) The projects should be based on accepted methods of achieving
19 beneficial enhancement or restoration results; and

20 (d) The projects should enhance the viability of the preserved
21 farmland to provide agricultural production while conforming to any

23 (12) In determining the acquisition priorities for forestland
24 projects, the board must consider, at a minimum, the following

27 (b) A recommendation as part of a limiting factors or critical

29 a coordinated regionwide prioritization effort;

30 (c) The likelihood of conversion of the site to nontimber or more

37 (e) Multiple benefits of the project;

38 (f) Project attributes, including but not limited to:

39 (i) Clean air and water;

40 (ii) Storm water management;

1 (iii) Wildlife habitat; and

2 (iv) Potential for carbon sequestration.

3 (13) In allotting funds for environmental enhancement or
4 restoration projects, the board must require the projects to meet the
5 following criteria:

6 (a) Enhancement or restoration projects must further the
7 ecological functions of the forestlands;

8 (b) The projects, such as fencing, bridging watercourses,
9 replanting native vegetation, replacing culverts, etc., must be less
10 than fifty percent of the acquisition cost of the project including
11 any in-kind contribution by any party;

12 (c) The projects should be based on accepted methods of achieving
13 beneficial enhancement or restoration results;

14 (d) The projects should enhance the viability of the preserved
15 forestland to provide timber production while conforming to any legal
16 requirements for habitat protection.

17 (14) Before November 1st of each even-numbered year, the board
18 will recommend to the governor a prioritized list of all projects to
19 be funded under this section. The governor may remove projects from
20 the list recommended by the board and must submit this amended list
21 in the capital budget request to the legislature. The list must
22 include, but not be limited to, a description of each project and any
23 particular match requirement.

24 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7030.** (1) Funds appropriated in this act for
25 minor works may not be allotted until final project lists are
26 submitted to the office of financial management. Revisions to the
27 project lists are allowed for projects not anticipated at the time of
28 budget development but must be submitted to the office of financial
29 management, the house of representatives capital budget committee,
30 and the senate ways and means committee for review and comment and
31 must include an explanation of variances from the prior lists before
32 funds may be expended on the revisions. Any project list revisions
33 must be approved by the office of financial management before funds
34 may be expended from the minor works appropriation.

35 (2)(a) Minor works project lists are single line appropriations
36 that include multiple projects of a similar nature and that are
37 valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 each, with the exception of
38 higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to
39 \$2,000,000. All projects must meet the criteria included in this

1 subsection (2)(a). These projects should be completed within two
2 years of the appropriation with the funding provided. Agencies are
3 prohibited from including projects on their minor works lists that
4 are a phase of a larger project, and that if combined over a
5 continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,000,000, or \$2,000,000 for
6 higher education minor works projects. Improvements for accessibility
7 in compliance with the Americans with disabilities act may be
8 included in any of the minor works categories.

9 (b) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following:
10 Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that
11 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list;
12 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list;
13 movable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not
14 in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office
15 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a
16 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition;
17 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with
18 funding shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office of
19 financial management may make an exception to the limitations
20 described in this subsection (2)(b) for exigent circumstances after
21 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for
22 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

23 (c) Minor works preservation projects may include program
24 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual
25 minor works preservation project cost.

26 (d) This section does not apply to sections 3134 through 3136 of
27 this act.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7031. FOR THE STATE TREASURER—TRANSFERS**

29 Public works assistance account—state: For transfer
30 to the water pollution control revolving account, up to
31 \$5,000,000 for fiscal year 2018 and up to \$5,000,000 for
32 fiscal year 2019. \$10,000,000

33 Public works assistance account—state: For transfer
34 to the drinking water assistance account, up to \$5,000,000
35 for fiscal year 2018 and up to \$5,000,000 for fiscal
36 year 2019. \$10,000,000

37 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7032. STATE TREASURER TRANSFER AUTHORITY**

1 State Toxics Control Account: For transfer to the
2 environmental legacy stewardship account, \$5,125,000 for
3 fiscal year 2018 and \$5,125,000 for fiscal year 2019. . . \$10,250,000

4 Local Toxics Control Account: For transfer to the
5 environmental legacy stewardship account, \$18,625,000 in
6 fiscal year 2018 and \$18,625,000 in fiscal year 2019. . . \$37,250,000

7 (1)(a) As directed by the department of ecology in consultation
8 with the office of financial management, the state treasurer shall
9 transfer amounts among the state toxics control account, the local
10 toxics control account, and the environmental legacy stewardship
11 account as needed during the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium to maintain
12 positive account balances in all three accounts.

13 (b) If, after using the interfund transfer authority granted in
14 this section, the department of ecology determines that further
15 reductions are needed to maintain positive account balances in the
16 state toxics control account, the local toxics control account, and
17 the environmental legacy stewardship account, the department is
18 authorized to delay the start of stormwater and clean-up projects
19 based on acuity of need, readiness to proceed, cost-efficiency,
20 purposes of increasing affordable housing, or need to ensure
21 geographic distribution. If the department uses this authority, the
22 department must submit a prioritized list of projects that may be
23 delayed to the office of financial management and the appropriate
24 fiscal committees of the legislature.

25 (2) As directed by the pollution liability insurance agency in
26 consultation with the office of financial management, the state
27 treasurer shall transfer from the pollution liability insurance
28 program trust account to the underground storage tank revolving
29 account the lesser of \$20,000,000 or the balance of the fund
30 exceeding \$7,500,000 after excluding the reserves during the
31 2017-2019 fiscal biennium.

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7033.** To the extent that any appropriation
33 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building
34 construction account, or from any other capital project account in
35 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is
36 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the
37 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or
38 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are

1 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum
2 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7034.** The energy efficiency account is hereby
4 created in the state treasury. The sums deposited in the energy
5 recovery act account shall be appropriated and expended for loans,
6 loan guarantees, and grants for projects that encourage the
7 establishment and use of innovative and sustainable industries for
8 renewable energy and energy efficiency technology. The balance of
9 state funds, federal funds, and loan repayments, from the energy
10 recovery act account, are deposited in this account.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7035.** (1)(a) A legislative task force on
12 projecting costs to complete the Columbia basin project is
13 established, with members as provided in this subsection.

14 (i) The president of the senate shall appoint two members from
15 the senate, one from each of the two largest caucuses of the senate.

16 (ii) The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint
17 two members from the house of representatives, one from each of the
18 two largest caucuses of the house of representatives.

19 (iii) The governor shall appoint one member representing the
20 governor.

21 (b) The task force shall choose its chair from among the
22 legislators in its membership. Legislative members shall convene the
23 initial meeting of the task force.

24 (2) The task force shall review the following issues:

25 (a) Costs to complete the project;

26 (b) Timeline, stages, and stakeholders needed to complete the
27 project; and

28 (c) Feasibility of completing the project.

29 (3) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the
30 senate committee services and the house of representatives office of
31 program research.

32 (4) Legislative members of the task force are reimbursed for
33 travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative
34 members are not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they
35 are elected officials or are participating on behalf of an employer,
36 governmental entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for
37 other nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW.

1 (5) The expenses of the task force must be paid jointly by the
2 senate and the house of representatives. Task force expenditures are
3 subject to approval by the senate facilities and operations committee
4 and the house of representatives executive rules committee, or their
5 successor committees.

6 (6) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations
7 to the appropriate committees of the legislature by September 30,
8 2017.

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 7036.** This act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of
11 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes
12 effect immediately.
